## Hingham Public Schools Foreign Language Course Sequences

## Spanish Sequence 1

This course sequence begins in $6^{\text {th }}$ grade. Students can enter Spanish 7 without Spanish 6 if they complete summer work beforehand. Students may move from the upper standard to the equivalent honors course with a minimum A- average and teacher recommendation. Students with a final average of less than B- in an honors course will be recommended for the equivalent upper standard course in the following school year. A C- average is required in order to continue to the next course.


Beginning in the $9^{\text {th }}$ grade, students may elect to take courses in two different languages. In that case, they would follow the course sequence for each language.

## Spanish Sequence 2

This course sequence begins in $9^{\text {th }}$ grade, or any subsequent year, and is appropriate for students starting out in Spanish or for those who have not achieved the required C- grade in Spanish 8 at HMS. A C - average is required in order to continue to the next course.


Beginning in the $9^{\text {th }}$ grade, students may elect to take courses in two different languages. In that case, they would follow the course sequence for each language.

## French Sequence 1

This course sequence begins in $6^{\text {th }}$ grade. Students may enter French 7 without French 6 if they complete summer work beforehand. Students may move from the upper standard to the equivalent honors course with a minimum A- average and teacher recommendation. Students with a final average of less than B-in an honors course will be recommended for the equivalent upper standard course in the following school year. A C- average is required course in order to continue to the next course.


Beginning in the $9^{\text {th }}$ grade, students may elect to take courses in two different languages. In that case, they would follow the course sequence for each language.

## French Sequence 2

This course sequence begins in $9^{\text {th }}$ grade, or any subsequent year, and is appropriate for students starting out in French or for those who have not achieved the required C- grade in French 8 at HMS. A Caverage is required in order to continue to the next course.


Beginning in the $9^{\text {th }}$ grade, students may elect to take courses in two different languages. In that case, they would follow the course sequence for each language.

## Latin

This course sequence begins in $9^{\text {th }}$ grade, or any subsequent year. Students may move from the upper standard to the equivalent honors course with a minimum A-average and teacher recommendation.

Students with a final average of less than B- in an honors course will be recommended for the equivalent upper standard course in the following school year. A C- average is required in order to continue to the next course.


Beginning in the $9^{\text {th }}$ grade, students may elect to take courses in two different languages. In that case, they would follow the course sequence for each language.

## Chinese

This course sequence begins in $9^{\text {th }}$ grade, or any subsequent year. Students may move from the upper standard to the equivalent honors course with a minimum A- average and teacher recommendation.

Students with a final average of less than B-in an honors course will be recommended for the equivalent upper standard course in the following school year. A C- average is required in an upper standard course in order to continue to the next course.


Beginning in the $9^{\text {th }}$ grade, students may elect to take courses in two different languages. In that case, they would follow the course sequence for each language.
