

## May 23, 2021 Some important updates from HHS:

- 1. The signs of hope are many. To begin with: **Nobody at HHS tested positive for COVID last week**. It's been a long time since we could say that but it clearly points to better days ahead!
- 2. Another sign of hope: New DESE guidelines for MA high school graduation ceremonies will allow us to return to a **traditional format for our commencement exercises** on June 5th. Social distancing and mask requirements, along with guest limits, have been removed. Seniors and their families can expect additional details from HHS administration next week.
- 3. More good news: HHS has announced the **valedictorian and salutatorian** for the Class of 2021. Congratulations to Catie Manning and Emma Beyer!
- 4. 7 of our last 16 days of school will include **MCAS testing**. All sophomores will take the Math MCAS later this week, on Thursday 5/27 and Friday 5/28. All juniors who have elected to take the MCAS will take the ELA exam on Tuesday 6/1 and Wednesday 6/2; they will take the Math exam on Thursday 6/3 and Friday 6/4. All ninth graders enrolled in a Biology class this year will take the Biology MCAS on Monday 6/7.
- 5. For the most part, **transition to the revised schedule** went well last week, even though attendance in last-period Directed Studies fell short of our target. Full-day attendance remains an expectation as well as a goal.
- 6. We continue to see many tardy arrivals in the morning. due in large part to traffic congestion. We **urge students to arrive earlier**, as drop-offs move much more easily until about five minutes before the start of school, at which point we often experience gridlock.
- 7. The response to Friday's survey illustrated a high level of enthusiasm for a **vaccination clinic** at school. Therefore, HPS is now taking steps to set up a clinic for students. We will communicate additional details as they become available.
- 8. As HHS administrators begin to build the **schedule** for the 2021-2022 school year, be assured that we expect a "return to normal" (i.e., 57-minute periods, a seven-period "drop-one" rotation, etc.) in that regard next year.
