

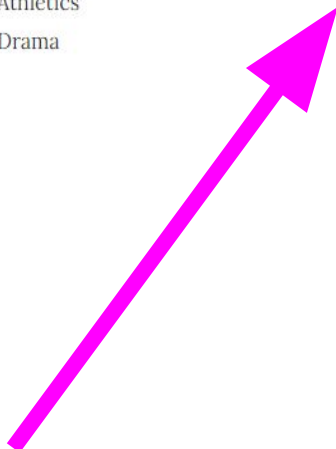

Freshman Advisory and Mentor Program

Students meet about once a month with a faculty advisor in a small group setting- ratio 1:16/18

Goal is to give freshmen an opportunity to get to know a supportive adult in a different capacity than as a teacher

Mr. Louchheim (history teacher) is the coordinator of Freshman Advisory.



Freshman Advisory and Mentor Program

Mentor Program-groups students with similar interests to ease the transition to HHS and create a united student body

Purpose- inspire friendships, guidance, and advice throughout all grades

Who-sophomores, juniors or seniors apply to become mentors

4-6 mentors in every advisory group-same group all year

Tutoring-mentors who tutor are “experts” in that subject-help with papers, projects, quizzes, tests or anything else (Starting in October)

MENTAL HEALTH SAFETY CONCERN REPORTING PROTOCOL for PARENTS

We at HHS take very seriously the safety and mental health of our students. In this day and age of constant contact and communication, our kids often pick up when their friends are struggling with problems before we do as adults. Whether it be in person or through social media, kids often give off warning signs that they need help. While it can be hard to know how serious a situation is, it is best practice to err on the side of caution. If your child shares concerns with you about another child's immediate safety it is vital that you take action. We strongly encourage all parents to follow the protocol below:

- In the event that you are concerned about the immediate safety of a student please call the school immediately. Do not leave a message. Speak to someone who can note and address your concern.
- If you are alarmed about a student's immediate safety outside of school hours, and you cannot reach that child's parent/guardian directly, call 911 or the police. They can conduct a wellness check.
- If you are concerned about your own child's immediate safety, we recommend calling the Crisis Team at South Shore Mental Health: 617-774-6036

Supports

Calm Classroom: Tier 1 District-Wide Implementation

Adjustment Counseling: the School Adjustment Counselor works to promote the social-emotional well being of students. Often students who have a difficult time adjusting to the high school, or are experiencing social or emotional upset will see the school adjustment counselor to insure that they can build skills and strategies to better access the curriculum and to prevent barriers to learning. The school adjustment counselor can also provide referrals to outside community services so ongoing therapeutic relationships can be established and maintained when necessary.

Transition Room: Short term service for students returning to HHS after an extended absence due to illness, injury or hospitalization. The goal is to provide structure, organization and communication for the student and teachers in creating a plan to transition back to a normal schedule.
