First Day of School - Tuesday, September 5th

The first day of school will begin with "Super Homeroom" meetings; check the listings for room assignments posted in the main lobby and hallways. Students will be receiving paper versions of the beginning of school paperwork at the first "Super Homeroom" meeting. These forms can also be found on our website. All forms need to be completed by September 18. Please remember to bring your class schedule with you on the first day. We will begin with a Day 1 schedule on September 5th.

The regular school day starts at 8:00 a.m. Students must be in their class by this time in order to avoid being marked absent and/or tardy. Classes end at 2:32 p.m. Classes are 57 minutes in length. Students will be assigned to one of three lunches (24 minutes) between 11:06 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. The lunch schedule will be communicated via email and announced on the first day of school. Students who forget something at home will not be called to the office unless it is an emergency. Students should be responsible for checking the drop off table, outside the main entrance, to see if an item has been dropped off for them.

Parents are expected to review the <u>Student Handbook / Code of Discipline</u> carefully and communicate any questions or concerns with the school. The <u>Student Handbook / Code of Discipline</u> is available online. Parents and students are expected to confirm that they have reviewed them.

Administration

Hingham High School has a principal, Mr. Richard Swanson, and two assistant principals. Mrs. Nicole Nosek works with students whose last names begin with the letters A through K, and Mrs. Nicole Piantes works with students whose last names begin with the letters L through Z. The assistant principals' job has many facets. Depending on the circumstances, they counsel, advise, discipline, and administer regulations. They are also assigned a number of other administrative and supervisory responsibilities.

School Counselors

School counselors are typically assigned for four years. The assignments are made alphabetically. The counselors will meet with the students during the orientation program, and at various times throughout the year. They will be eager to get to know all of their students.

Attendance

Good attendance is one of the school's primary concerns. Only the most serious of reasons should prevent a student from attending school and being on time. Telephone calls may be made to the homes of absentees, and parents will be notified in the event of any class cuts. Individual class attendance is reported quarterly on the report cards and although there may be some legitimate discrepancies from class to class (field trips, dismissals, etc.), pronounced irregularities merit parental concern. If a student must be absent, dismissed or tardy, their parent or guardian must confirm knowledge and approval in reply to a school email. All notes should be given to the assistant principals' administrative assistant, Ms. Griffin. Home and school should work together to encourage attitudes of responsibility, good attendance and punctuality. Please note attendance rules in the handbook.

<u>Dress</u>

The responsibility for the dress and appearance of students rests with individual students and parents/guardians. Students are expected to dress appropriately for school. Clothing that is disruptive to school property, causes disorder, or poses a safety or health risk to the student or others is unacceptable. Health regulations require that shoes be worn at all times in a public building. The administration is authorized to take action in instances where individual dress does not meet the stated requirements.

Lockers and Valuables

All students may request their own locker by contacting their assistant principal. These lockers are provided for the convenience of the students. The school reserves the right to inspect lockers at any time. Because students are responsible for their own personal belongings as well as school-issued textbooks, the school strongly recommends and encourages students to place locks on their lockers. Money and all other valuables should be kept at home. In exceptional cases, valuables may be left in the main office. The Hingham Public Schools is not responsible for items lost or stolen from lockers. Students in physical education classes and athletes involved in interscholastic sports should never leave valuables in an unlocked locker.

School Supplies

There is no published list of required school supplies at Hingham High School. If items are required, individual teachers will inform students on the orientation day or the first day of class.

Report Cards

Report cards will be posted online quarterly. The Aspen portal is updated regularly. All teachers will have current grades posted at the midterm of each quarter.

Discipline

Written communication will follow serious disciplinary problems.
