As HHS students returned to the cafeteria this week, they were able to take advantage of the freemeal policy that is available to all public school students across the state. Because of renewed funding in the state budget, all students are entitled to one free meal in the morning and another at lunch. This program is now expected to be permanent. Meanwhile, here in Hingham, another notable change comes as the result of a new town-wide policy, approved last spring by the Select Board, that restricts the procurement, sale, and distribution of single-use plastic water bottles, as of 9/1/23, in the schools and municipal buildings. Therefore, the HHS cafeteria will no longer sell single-use plastic water bottles. In keeping with our school's commitment to sustainability and environmental consciousness, we encourage students to bring their own reusable water bottles, which can be filled at a regular water bubbler or at one of our five hydration stations.

In other news,the Make-A-Wish Rhode Island and Massachusetts is recruiting students to engage with its Youth Leadership Council (YLC). Interested students can learn more about the YLC by clicking <u>this link</u>.

Finally, the HHS campus is already abuzz with activity, and we've got plenty to look forward to, including:


