1 - APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Minutes from the last School Council meeting (04-26-23) were approved unanimously.

2 - SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT GOAL #2 (COMMUNITY SERVICE)

Discussion included the following points:

- The draft of the <u>policy language</u> developed by the subcommittee remains available for the Council's review.
- KS has made additional improvements to the website and confirms that it is now ready to launch.
- The main functions of the website will be to 1) submit a community service opportunity; or 2) find an opportunity.
- RS will seek PTO reimbursement for fees associated with the domain name ("hhscommunityservice") and hosting of the website.
- MA has confirmed with the superintendent that the school district would not have liability for opportunities listed on the community service website.

3 - SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT GOAL #5 (SCHOOL CULTURE & "SENSE OF BELONGING")

The Council reviewed data (See Appendix A) from the Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS) taken by HHS 9th- and 10th-grade students in March 2023.

- Council members concurred that a flex block would enable HHS to better confront issues related to loneliness and connection.
- The Council will seek to cross-reference Questions 26-28 with Question 99 in order to consider the impact of participation in extracurricular activities.
- For the sake of comparison, we ought to seek similar data from other schools.
- Council members are optimistic that the introduction of new "Pathways" programs next year will lead to improvement in the "sense of belonging" for participating students.

4 - SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT GOAL #4 (ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP)

In a discussion about potential action steps, 1) JL recommended that the Green Team's "Slash the Trash" contest seek to engage other clubs, not just teams; 2) AV recommended service projects, such as beach cleanups; 3) KS offered to invite Laura Burns to the next meeting; and 4) PS urged all Council members to bring three new ideas to the next meeting.
