• We learned on Wednesday that HHS has been named the 2024 AFS-USA Global School of the Year. If that sounds like a big deal, well, it is. Each year, AFS recognizes one school "that demonstrates a commitment to cultural diversity, global competence, and curriculum internationalization as these practices are in alignment with the AFS-USA mission of creating a more just and peaceful world through intercultural learning and exchange." Chosen from a national field, HHS can take great pride in an honor that reflects well on our whole school and community. This award belongs to all of us!



- 24 HHS students participated in the <u>Harvard Model UN</u>, the nation's "oldest, largest, and most prestigious UN simulation for high school students" over the weekend. For three days, they represented China and Pakistan, while further developing their skills as leaders and peacemakers!
- A well-deserving HHS sophomore, <u>Ethan Warhaftig</u>, was named the "Opry Award" winner for January; like its namesake, our school's much-loved comfort dog, the award seeks to recognize a student who improves school climate and helps others to feel comfortable at HHS.
- Report cards were posted this morning.
- <u>Laura Da Silva</u>, a junior, became the first HHS student nominated for "<u>Student of the Week</u>" honors in the Patriot Ledger's new weekly poll.
- The music department delivered a terrific all-town chorus concert last night.

Looking ahead: Next week marks the third annual HHS Unity Week, which will feature...

• Daily dress-up themes, including red-white-and-blue on Monday; purple (for <u>Maddie's Promise</u>) on Tuesday; turquoise or blue (for the <u>Anna Quinlivan Scholarship</u> Fund) on Wednesday;

- orange (for Nephcure) on Thursday; and red on Friday;
- a visit from motivational speaker <u>Earl Granville</u>, who will deliver whole-school assemblies on Monday <sup>2</sup>/<sub>5</sub>;
- an Open Mic Night, sponsored by our music department, at 7 PM that evening;
- a special Ninth Grade Advisory session, delivered by older peer mentors, on Tuesday 2/6;
- a series of "Breathe Out" events, organized by a student club that focuses on mental health awareness, throughout the day on Wednesday 2/7;
- a presentation ("Allyship 101") from our GSA after school on Thursday 2/8;
- HHS students visiting elementary schools to serve as guest readers on Friday 2/9;
- food drives to benefit the Hingham Food Pantry at home basketball games on the evenings of Tuesday 2/6 (the boys' team vs. Silver Lake) and Friday 2/9 (the girls' team vs. Duxbury); anyone who donates at least one non-perishable food item will be admitted to the game for free; and
- a movie night (free for HHS students) after the basketball game on Friday 2/9.

These events, planned by HHS students in several clubs, reflect the overarching vision of the HHS Unity Project, a student group that strives to ensure that our school community is characterized by its core values of Respect, Inclusion, Safety and Equity (RISE) for everybody.

#### Not to be overlooked:

- Next week is <u>National School Counseling Week</u> and, therefore, the perfect time to say THANK YOU to the incredible crew of <u>counselors</u> here at HHS.
- HHS will deliver its annual "Program of Studies Night" on Monday 2/12 at 6:30 PM. After introductory remarks about course selection in the auditorium, parents will have an opportunity to meet with department directors and coordinators in the school cafeteria. Student volunteers will provide building tours for any interested parents.
- Students will be dismissed at 11:30 AM on Wednesday 2/7 so teachers can spend the afternoon in professional development workshops.
- <u>Registration is open</u> for the preschool program run by the HHS Child Development classes. We still have a few openings, but they won't last long!
- Seniors should take the time to explore the <u>many Town of Hingham scholarship opportunities</u>. Applications must be submitted by 3 PM on Friday 3/8.

Registration remains open for the SAT, which will be offered at HHS during the school day for the first time on Friday 4/12 from 8 - 11 AM. The "SAT School Day" is for juniors only, completely optional, and requires an <u>online signup</u>. Juniors who do not take the SAT that day will attend their regular classes; meanwhile, class absences for those who take the SAT will be considered exempt.

#### A reminder for parents about the <u>dismissal procedure</u> at HHS:

- If your student needs to be dismissed from school, please send them into school with a note that specifies the time of dismissal.
- Before school, your student should bring that note to either Ms. Griffin (located by Ms. Piantes's office) or Ms. White (located by Ms. Nosek's office) in order to acquire a dismissal slip.
- If there is an unexpected dismissal, you should 1) call Ms. Griffin (x2001) and 2) confirm the request in writing via email (pgriffin@hinghamschools.org) so she can then give the student a dismissal slip.
- At the appropriate dismissal time, students may leave the building after showing the dismissal slip to their teacher. It is not necessary for parents to come into the building to sign their
