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As we closed out the last week of the month...

- HHS officially received its <u>2024 AFS-USA Global School of the</u> <u>Year award</u> at a <u>ceremony in Washington DC</u> on Monday 3/25.
- All HHS students attended grade-level assemblies in conjunction with our third annual <u>Hingham CARES</u> Day on Tuesday.



- The Drama Club held auditions for its spring play, "*Much Ado About Nothing*," on Tuesday and Wednesday.
- All sophomores completed two days of ELA MCAS testing on Tuesday and Wednesday.
- The counseling department hosted its annual "College Admissions Panel" on Tuesday evening.
- All ninth- and eleventh-grade students completed the <u>Youth Risk Behavior Survey</u> (YRBS), administered annually, both here at HHS and at many other schools across the country, on Tuesday.
- <u>Ryan Chang '25</u> became the first HHS student in 15 years to compete as a finalist in the MA Association of Mathematics Olympiad Contest. Our school's impressive roster of semifinalists included Tori Dell '26, Gabe Synnott '24, Ethan Warhaftig '26, Matteo Cobin '25, Parker Bradl '25, Tala Sanford '25, and Aidan Blanch '24.


College Admissions Panel
