## Profile of the Graduating Class of 2019 Table of Contents

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## Summary Statements

- Page 4     **A Summary of Plans**  
91.2% of students in the Class of 2019 (277 graduates) attended four-year colleges. The overall percentage of graduates who plan to continue their formal education now stands at 94.9%.
- Pages 17-18     **SAT**  
The SAT changed for students beginning with the class of 2017. There are now two sections: Evidence –Based Reading & Writing and Math. There is no longer a separate writing section. The total score is out of 1 600 possible points each section ranging from 200-800 points. There is an optional essay section of the exam. The College Board reports that scores on the new exam may not be compared to the old exam because the two tests are based on different score scales and different benchmarks. Additionally the College Board now reports scores based on a calendar year of testing rather than on a cohort group such as the Class of 2019. The mean scores on the new SAT for the class of 2019 taken during the 2018-2019 school year was 1200 for Hingham High students, 1120 for Massachusetts, and 1059 for the nation.
- SAT Evidence-Based Reading and Writing**  
Hingham High School's mean score was 601 compared to the Massachusetts mean of 559 and the national mean of 531.
- SAT Math**  
Hingham High School's mean score was 600 compared to the Massachusetts mean of 561 and the national mean of 582.
- Page 19     **SAT Subject Tests**  
The SAT Subject Tests are one-hour multiple-choice tests in specific subjects. Unlike the SAT Reasoning Test which measures more general abilities, the SAT Subject Tests measure knowledge of a particular subject and the ability to apply that knowledge. At present, only 3 colleges *require* SAT Subject Tests and another 13 *recommend* them for all applicants. There are 13 additional colleges that require or recommend them for certain programs or scholarship eligibility. Over and above these requirements or recommendations, Subject Test scores can serve to highlight a student's areas of strength. The College Board is not providing total group (national) or state-level mean scores for SAT Subject exams.
- Page 19     **Biology SAT Subject Tests**  
In Hingham, the Biology test (Ecological or Molecular) is usually taken by honors-level students upon completion of the course in the 9<sup>th</sup> grade year. The Hingham curriculum is aligned to the MCAS rather than the SAT Subject Test. However, between the two subject tests, the curriculum lends itself more to the Ecological focus. Students must complete a good amount of self-directed preparation in order to be prepared for the Biology Subject Tests. Students are generally not exposed to molecular concepts until they have completed chemistry. The mean score of 26 Hingham students on the Biology-E exam was 654, 41 points higher

than last year's cohort. 25 students took the Biology-M exam scoring a mean of 640 which is down 27 points from the previous year.

- Page 19     **Chemistry SAT Subject Test**  
The Subject Test in Chemistry is usually taken at the end of the 10<sup>th</sup> grade year in Hingham as compared to at the end of the junior year in the rest of the state and country. There are areas of overlap with the Hingham curriculum and the SAT Subject test material. However, students need to do self-directed outside study in order to be most successful on the exam. Hingham's mean Chemistry score was 650, a decrease of 36 points. 22 students sat for this exam.
- Page 19     **English Literature SAT Subject Test**  
The mean score for in 2019 rose by 30 points. This year 18 students sat for the exam. The mean score has increase in each of the last four years.
- Page 19     **Mathematics Level I SAT Subject Test**  
Scores for students in 2019 rose by16 points compared to the previous year, earning a mean of 669. Most students who take the Math I exam are enrolled in our college preparatory curriculum.
- Page 19     **Mathematics Level II SAT Subject Test**  
The mean score of 700 on the Math Level II is five points higher than last year's mean of 695. Math II is the more difficult of the two math exam offerings covering the same material as Math I with the addition of some trigonometry and elementary functions (precalculus) as well. 25 students sat for this exam.
- Page 19     **Physics SAT Subject Test**  
14 students took the physics test in 2019. Students achieved at a slightly lower level than last year scoring a mean of 659.
- Page 19     **United States History SAT Subject Test**  
The mean score on the US History exam rose by 35 points. 22 students elected to take the exam. Note: typically a mean is reported for the World History exam as well, however too few students, 6, sat for the exam to report a reliable mean.
- Page 20     **ACT**  
The ACT Corporation continues to report mean scores and data based on the graduating class cohort. Data contained in this report is for the Class of 2019. 96 students took the ACT. This year's scores increased slightly compared to those of the previous year. The mean composite score of Hingham students was a 27.9 composite compared to 25.5 and 20.7 in the state and nation respectively.
- Page 21     **Advanced Placement Exams**  
Of the 277 graduates of Hingham High School in 2019, 130 seniors took 280 Advanced Placement exams. Approximately 47% of the graduating class participated in the AP program by taking one or more exams. In total, 255 students took 472 exams. The impressive level of competence demonstrated by our students proves that they are truly ready for college level work.

- Page 24      **AP Mean Grades**  
47% of the graduates took an AP class. Our students demonstrated mastery of college level content during high school.
- Page 26-28      **AP Course Enrollment and Percent of Grade 3 or Better**  
28 different AP exams were taken in May 2019. 20 were offered at HHS and 7 through our Virtual High School program. 47% of the senior class participated in the AP program by taking at least one AP class. Hingham has the ninth best AP performance in the state of Massachusetts with a 94% pass rate on 472 exams.
- Page 29      **AP Scholars**  
100 of the 255 candidates (39%) who took AP exams were named AP Scholars. 5 of our students were named National Scholars. This award is granted to students who receive an average grade of 4 or higher on all AP exams taken and a grade of 4 or higher on eight or more exams.
- Page 30      **National Merit Scholarships**  
12 students or 4% of the graduating class earned recognition from the National Merit Scholarship Corporation. There was 1 semifinalist student in the Class of 2019 and 11 who received commendations for their achievement on the test.

## SAT Subject Tests

The SAT Subject Tests are one-hour multiple-choice tests in specific subjects. Unlike the SAT Reasoning Test which measures more general abilities, the SAT Subject Tests measure knowledge of a particular subject and the ability to apply that knowledge.

The College Board offers about 20 Subject Tests. Members of Hingham's Class of 2019 sat for 11 exams. At present, only 3 colleges *require* SAT Subject Tests and another 13 *recommend* them for all applicants. There are 13 additional colleges that require or recommend them for certain programs or scholarship eligibility. Over and above these requirements or recommendations, Subject Test scores can serve to highlight a student's areas of strength. The Biology SAT Subject test in Hingham is taken in June of the 9<sup>th</sup> grade. Statewide and nationally the test is typically taken in June of the junior year. The Chemistry Subject test in Hingham is taken in June of the 10<sup>th</sup> grade. Statewide and nationally the test is typically taken in 11<sup>th</sup> grade.

## Advanced Placement Exams

The Advanced Placement (AP) program consists of a series of college – level courses and exams for secondary school students. Typically over 1 million high school students take at least one AP exam nationwide. Satisfactory completion of an Advanced Placement examination may make it possible for a student to earn college credit or advanced standing in college prior to arrival on the college campus.

28 different exams were taken by Hingham High School students. 20 AP classes were offered at HHS and 8 through Virtual High School. Physics students take 2 exams as part of their physics class. Of the 277 graduates of Hingham High School in June 2019, 130 seniors took 280 Advanced Placement exams. Approximately 47% of the graduating class participated in the AP program by taking one or more exams. In total, 255 students took 472 exams.

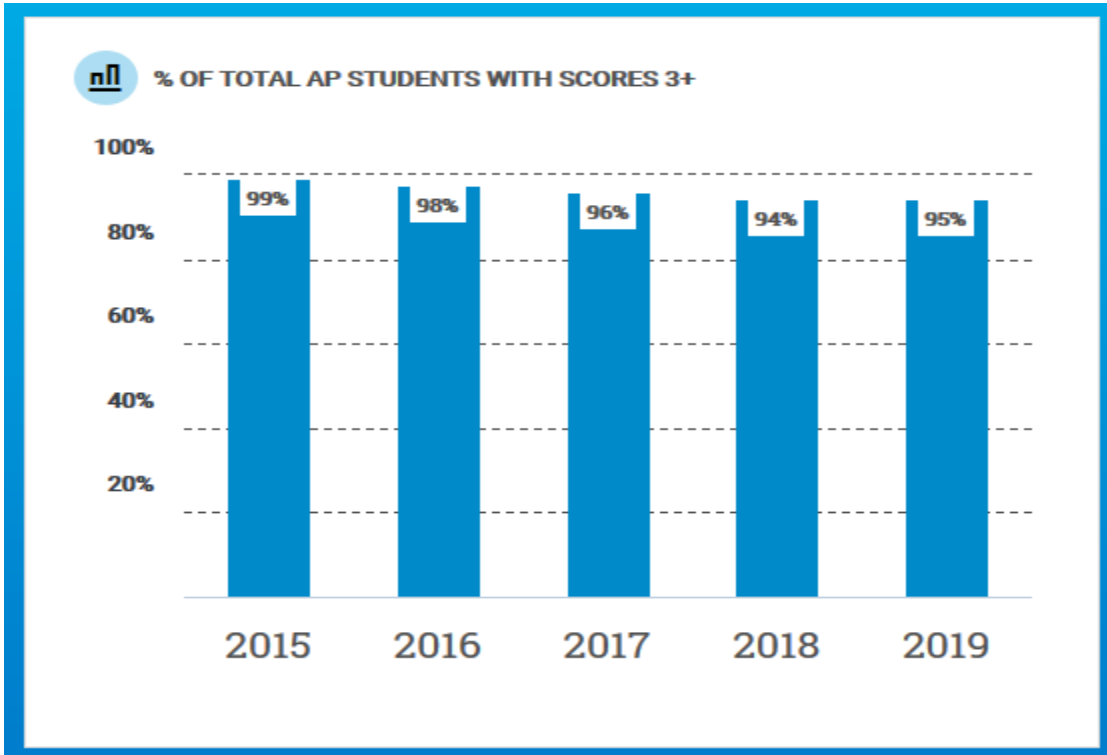

## Hingham High School Advanced Placement Scholars

AP Scholars are designated in recognition of their exceptional achievement on the college level Advanced Placement (AP) examination. In Hingham, 100 or 39% of the 255 candidates were so honored.

The **AP Scholar** award is granted to students who receive grades of 3 or higher on three or more AP exams.

The **AP Scholar with Honor** award is granted to students who receive an average grade of at least 3.25 on all AP exams taken, and grades of 3 or higher on four or more of these exams.

The **AP Scholar with Distinction** award is granted to students who receive an average grade of at least 3.5 on all AP exams taken and grades of 3 or higher on five or more of these exams.

The **AP National Scholar** is granted to students in the US who receive an average grade of at least 4 on all AP exams taken and grades of 4 or higher on eight or more of these exams.

The **AP International Diploma** is a globally recognized award for students interested in pursuing university study outside of their native country.

The **AP Seminar and Research Certificate** is awarded to students who earn scores of 3 or higher in AP Seminar and AP Research but not on four additional AP Exams receive the AP Seminar and Research Certificate.

National Merit Scholarship Competition**

Merit scholars are identified from their performance on the PSAT/NMSQT. A student who is identified as a “semifinalist” is one who has scored in the top half of one percent of each state's high school senior class. Scholarship awards made to semifinalists identify those students as finalists. Semifinalists bring honor to their schools and their parents. However, it is the individual student who is recognized in the merit program for outstanding test performance that indicates exceptional academic promise.
