Summary Statements

Page 4 A Summary of Plans

90.7% of students in the Class of 2018 (324 graduates) attended four-year colleges. The overall percentage of graduates who plan to continue their formal education now stands at 94.4%.

Pages 17-18 SAT

The SAT changed for students beginning with the class of 2017. There are now two sections: Evidence –Based Reading & Writing and Math. There is no longer a separate writing section. The total score is out of 1600 possible points each section ranging from 200-800 points. There is an optional essay section of the exam. The College Board reports that scores on the new exam may not be compared to the old exam because the two tests are based on different score scales and different benchmarks. Additionally the College Board now reports scores based on a calendar year of testing rather than on a cohort group such as the Class of 2018. The mean scores on the new SAT for the class of 2018 taken during the 2017-2018 school year was 1221 for Hingham High students, 1125 for Massachusetts, and 1068 for the nation.

SAT Evidence-Based Reading and Writing

Hingham High School's mean score was 612 compared to the Massachusetts mean of 562 and the national mean of 536.

SAT Math

Hingham High School's mean score was 608 compared to the Massachusetts mean of 563 and the national mean of 531.

Page 19 SAT Subject Tests

The SAT Subject Tests are one-hour multiple-choice tests in specific subjects. Unlike the SAT Reasoning Test which measures more general abilities, the SAT Subject Tests measure knowledge of a particular subject and the ability to apply that knowledge. At present, only 3 colleges *require* SAT Subject Tests and another 13 *recommend* them for all applicants. There are 13 additional colleges that require or recommend them for certain programs or scholarship eligibility. Over and above these requirements or recommendations, Subject Test scores can serve to highlight a student's areas of strength. The College Board is not providing total group (national) or state-level mean scores for SAT Subject exams.

Page 20-21 Biology SAT Subject Tests

In Hingham, the Biology test (Ecological or Molecular) is usually taken by honorslevel students upon completion of the course in the 9th grade year. The Hingham curriculum is aligned to the MCAS rather than the SAT Subject Test. However, between the two subject tests, the curriculum lends itself more to the Ecological focus. Students must complete a good amount of self-directed preparation in order to be prepared for the Biology Subject Tests. Students are generally not exposed to molecular concepts until they have completed chemistry. The mean score of 26 Hingham students on the Biology-E exam was 613, 39 points lower than last year's cohort. 25 students took the Biology-M exam scoring a mean of 667 which is down 42 points from the previous year, but the same as the mean score in 2016.

Page 22 Chemistry SAT Subject Test

The Subject Test in Chemistry is usually taken at the end of the 10th grade year in Hingham as compared to at the end of the junior year in the rest of the state and country. There are areas of overlap with the Hingham curriculum and the SAT Subject test material. However, students need to do self-directed outside study in order to be most successful on the exam. Hingham's mean Chemistry score was 686, a decrease of 23 points. 15 students sat for this exam.

Page 23 English Literature SAT Subject Test

The mean score for in 2018 rose by 5 points. This year 20 students sat for the exam. The mean score has increase in each of the last three years.

Page 24 Mathematics Level I SAT Subject Test

Scores for students in 2018 fell by 2 points compared to the previous year, earning a mean of 653. Most students who take the Math I exam are enrolled in our college preparatory curriculum.

Page 25 Mathematics Level II SAT Subject Test

The mean score of 695 on the Math Level II is essentially the same as last year's mean of 696. Math II is the more difficult of the two math exam offerings covering the same material as Math I with the addition of some trigonometry and elementary functions (precalculus) as well.

Page 26 Physics SAT Subject Test

14 students took the physics test in 2018. Students achieved at a slightly higher level than last year scoring a mean of 683.

Page 27 United States History SAT Subject Test

The mean score on the US History exam fell by 35 points. 29 students elected to take the exam. Note: typically a mean is reported for the World History exam as well, however too few students, 6, sat for the exam to report a reliable mean.

Page 28 ACT

The ACT Corporation continues to report mean scores and data based on the graduating class cohort. Data contained in this report is for the Class of 2018. 131 students took the ACT. This year's scores were similar to those of the previous year. The mean composite score of Hingham students was a 26.4 composite compared to 25.5 and 20.8 in the state and nation respectively.

Page 29 Advanced Placement Exams

Of the 324 graduates of Hingham High School in June 2018, 151 seniors took 308 Advanced Placement exams. Approximately 47% of the graduating class participated in the AP program by taking one or more exams. In total, 266 students took 484 exams. The impressive level of competence demonstrated by our students proves that they are truly ready for college level work.

Page 30 AP Mean Grades

47% of the graduates took an AP class. Our students demonstrated mastery of college level content during high school. Mean grades across all exams score at 3 or better indicating mastery of college level content across the span of Hingham's AP offerings.

Page 33-35 AP Course Enrollment and Percent of Grade 3 or Better

26 different AP exams were taken in May 2018. 19 were offered at HHS and 7 through our Virtual High School program. 47% of the senior class participated in the AP program by taking at least one AP class. Hingham has the eighth best AP performance in the state of Massachusetts with a 93% pass rate on 484 exams.

Page 36 AP Scholars

102 of the 266 candidates (38%) who took AP exams were named AP Scholars. 5 of our students were named National Scholars. This award is granted to students who receive an average grade of 4 or higher on all AP exams taken and a grade of 4 or higher on eight or more exams.

Page 37 National Merit Scholarships

11 students or 3% of the graduating class earned recognition from the National Merit Scholarship Corporation. There was 1 semifinalist student in the Class of 2018 and 10 who received commendations for their achievement on the test. Our 1 semi-finalist achieved finalist status, the first time since 2014.

Hingham High School Class of 2018 SAT Scores

2017 SAT performance results set a new baseline for future year-to-year comparisons. Scores cannot be compared to results prior to 2017 as they were based on the old SAT, which was scored on a different scale and had different benchmarks. The College Board has recently changed its score reporting methods. "For the years 2007 through 2016, the College Board reported SAT results based on graduate cohorts. Starting in 2017, SAT results are based on tests taken during the selected year."* The data that the College Board has made available and therefore contained in this report, "is based on students in the class of 2018 who took the SAT during the 2017-2018 school year. Test-takers are counted only once and only their latest scores...are summarized."* The vast majority of Hingham High School students begin to take the SAT in their junior year, which for the Class of 2018 would have been during the 2016-2017 school year.

When the College Board redesigned the SAT, they also redesigned college and career readiness benchmarks. Nationally, % of students in the class of 2018 who took the new SAT met or exceeded the new benchmarks, showing they are likely ready to take and succeed in entry-level, college-credit bearing courses. 80% of Hingham's class of 2018 met or exceeded the benchmarks as did % of the state. SAT Subject Tests

The SAT Subject Tests are one-hour multiple-choice tests in specific subjects. Unlike the SAT Reasoning Test which measures more general abilities, the SAT Subject Tests measure knowledge of a particular subject and the ability to apply that knowledge.

Some of the more than 20 Subject Tests offered are:

Biology-Ecological Biology-Molecular Chemistry English Literature World History French, French with Listening Latin Mathematics Level I Mathematics Level I Physics Spanish, Spanish with Listening US History World History

At present, only 3 colleges require SAT Subject Tests and another 13 recommend them for all applicants. There are 13 additional colleges that require or recommend them for certain programs or scholarship eligibility. Over and above these requirements or recommendations, Subject Test scores can serve to highlight a student's areas of strength.

Note: Hingham students who take the Biology Subject Test generally do so at the end of grade nine. Similarly, Chemistry Subject Tests are usually taken at the end of grade ten. Most students who participate in additional subject testing do so at the end of their junior year.








Hingham High School 2017-2018 School Year Biology - Molecular



Advanced Placement Exams

The Advanced Placement (AP) program consists of a series of college – level courses and exams for secondary school students. Typically over 1 million high school students took at least one AP exam nationwide. Satisfactory completion of an Advanced Placement examination makes it possible for a student to earn college credit or advanced standing in college prior to arrival on the college campus.

26 different exams were taken by Hingham High School students. 19 AP classes were offered at HHS and 7 through Virtual High School. Physics students take 2 exams as part of their physics class. Of the 324 graduates of Hingham High School in June 2018, 151 seniors took 308 Advanced Placement exams. Approximately 47% of the graduating class participated in the AP program by taking one or more exams. In total, 266 students took 484 exams.

11 Students were eligible for AP exams with accommodations representing 4.1% of AP test takers. These 11 students took 16 exams. Too few students took the same exam for mean scores to be reported separately. Of the 11 students, at the time of the exam, 3 received accommodations under CAP plans (when they existed) and 8 received accommodations under active 504 plans 1 student was recently on an active IEP receiving special education services at some point in the recent past.

Hingham offers some online AP courses through Virtual High School (VHS) that we do not offer in our building. The classes vary from year to year. Students have taken AP Environmental Science, AP Psychology, and AP Economics most often. There are too few students enrolled in each course to report meaningful statistics.

AP Scholars are designated in recognition of their exceptional achievement on the college level Advanced Placement (AP) examination. In Hingham, 102 or 38% of the 266 candidates were so honored.

The **AP Scholar** award is granted to students who receive grades of 3 or higher on three or more AP exams.

The **AP Scholar with Honor** award is granted to students who receive an average grade of at least 3.25 on all AP exams taken, and grades of 3 or higher on four or more of these exams.

The **AP Scholar with Distinction** award is granted to students who receive an average grade of at least 3.5 on all AP exams taken and grades of 3 or higher on five or more of these exams.

The **AP National Scholar** is granted to students in the US who receive an average grade of at least 4 on all AP exams taken and grades of 4 or higher on eight or more of these exams.

The **AP International Diploma** is a globally recognized award for students interested in pursuing university study outside of their native country. It requires students to display mastery on AP Exams across several disciplines and represents an exceptional level of achievement. Students must earn scores of 3 or higher on five or more total AP Exams based on the exam criteria requirements.
